School Daze at End 68



Yes, it's August already and school is about to start. We have been gearing up all summer so we can be prepared to once again carry out our mission of feeding food insecure children in Tampa. How do we make this happen? Our volunteers collaborate with school social workers to determine which families are in need.

There are many steps to getting food into the hands of the children we serve. In order for our shelves to be full, we receive food donations from food drives and monetary donations to purchase necessary items. For this to happen, several of our volunteers search out the best prices around town and then go fill baskets and baskets with food. When you shop, you probably buy a few cans of tuna at a time. Not us, it takes cases and cases of tuna to fulfill just one week's need! We use approximately \$10,000 worth of food each week once we are up and running for the school year.

We also have volunteers that take these cases and cases, open them, stock the shelves and discard the cardboard to recycling. Only now can volunteers come in and begin to fill bags with food to be distributed. Throughout the week, teams of volunteers work in the pantry filling bags with enough food for each child to have two breakfasts, 2 lunches, and three dinners. Our coordinator works hard to ensure weekly menus are varied so that we are not giving children the same food week after week—no small task. Each team fills the bags carefully to ensure that heavier items are evenly distributed in each bag—we have to remember small children will be carrying the bags. Bags are then placed on marked carts in family number order (we never know the names of our families for privacy). The carts are placed in our back room to await the next step.

Every Friday a very dedicated group of volunteers arrives to load their cars with each school's bags. After ensuring they have all bags, they head out to the schools and make delivery. Now we're ready to get started on next week!!




Complete Property Services Hosts and Packages 20,000 Meals for End 68
